



Funding Guidelines

General Guidelines

Organizations must have non-profit determination from the Internal Revenue Service and provide verification of such.

Projects are generally not funded for more than 50% of the total cost. All requests must include detailed list of other funding sources.

Requests will be considered on a quarterly basis and must be submitted by the first day of the last month in the quarter.

Requests must be submitted electronically using the standard grant application found on the Washington Financial Bank website, washfin.bank

Priority is given to those organizations supporting Health and Human Services needs, Community Redevelopment and Education.

Support for political candidates/campaigns or an organization's general operating expenses will not be considered.

Requests for support from religious organizations will only be considered if:

The program/project is open to the general public.

The program/project does not promote a specific religion.

The program/project is managed by a group distinctly separate from the religious organizations.
